# MIDSESSION SCORECARD

## DEAR PENNSYLVANIA TAXPAYER,



Americans for Prosperity-Pennsylvania is proud to release our mid-session scorecard for the Pennsylvania General Assembly's 2017-2018 legislative session. This scorecard highlights votes we deemed critical to economic freedom in the Commonwealth.

In the words of Yogi Berra, "It's déjà vu all over again." That seems to be an apt description of this year's budget process.

Starting in January 2015, we spent more than a year fighting against a \$4.5 billion tax increase proposed by Governor Tom Wolf. Fortunately, after you made 200,000 phone calls and sent countless emails and social media messages, the Fiscal Year 2015-16 budget closed in March 2016 without a tax increase.

The Fiscal Year 2016-17 budget was not as friendly to your wallet. The legislature grew government at the expense of taxpayers, and implemented a crippling tax on the vaping industry that caused more than 130 small businesses to close.

The Fiscal Year 2017-18 budget process has been a mix of the last two. Just like the 2015-16 budget, the current budget has yet to be resolved, long past the June deadline. And just like last year, the House

and Senate passed a spending plan before they passed the funding plan that dictates how they'd pay for it.

As always, there is a battle between those that want to tax you, and those that want you to keep more of your money. That fight continues.

At the beginning of this year, we held a press conference detailing ways to cut \$3.5 billion in wasteful spending, such as eliminating corporate welfare, passing reforms to the prevailing wage law, and rolling back the prohibition-era, state-run liquor system. We have seen small victories along the way.

In the spring, the House of Representatives passed a budget bill that reduced corporate welfare spending.

Throughout the summer we traveled the state talking about the need to "Free Our Spirits" and privatize the state liquor system. The House also passed five bills that would chip away at the state-run alcohol monopoly to give more choice and greater access to responsible consumers.

This fall, we have been back on the budget bandwagon, educating legislators and citizens about the need for reduced spending and the harm that befalls taxpayers when government grows. In September, the House Rules Committee amended House Bill 453, also known as the "Taxpayers' Budget," which would have funded the budget without raising taxes. That plan would have also reduced corporate welfare spending.

In this scorecard, you'll find we hold legislators accountable for missing votes. We also hold them accountable to procedural votes because we believe that good policy should be advanced and bad policy should be stopped at every opportunity. Additionally, we reward legislators who had the courage to sponsor great reforms with a credit toward their score, and deduct points when lawmakers sponsored legislation that would further limit our economic freedom.

Through it all, you are making a difference. With this scorecard, you can continue to hold your legislators accountable on the issues that are vital to the future of economic growth in our communities and across the Commonwealth. They are aware of their score, and so are you. We have witnessed an epic battle unfolding in Harrisburg. On one side are those that want to bailout Harrisburg's deficit on the backs of taxpayers, and those like us who believe Pennsylvanians know best how to spend their hard-earned dollars. Knowledge is power, and going into the second year of this session, you'll have the ability determine which lawmakers support policies that can grow our economy and which lawmakers support policies that grow government. We call on you to use this as a tool, and continue to be engaged.

## AFP-PENNSYLVANIA'S 2017-18 MIDSESSION ECONOMIC FREEDOM SCORECARD

The 2017-2018 Midsession Economic Freedom Scorecard review includes more than 1,500 individual votes from all 253 Pennsylvania state legislators on issues important to economic freedom.

Priority legislative issues areas include Budgets and Spending, Liquor Reform, Labor, Education, Licensure, and Taxes. Legislators were scored on their vote as it relates to AFP-Pennsylvania's stated position. Final scores for each legislator are determined by their percentage of votes cast with AFP's position.

We encourage our activists to review and compare how their lawmakers voted and hold them accountable for their support of or opposition to economic freedom.

- N/A = Not able to vote on legislation due to not yet being in office or not serving on a committee for vote

### PRIME SPONSOR CREDITS

We reward legislators who had the courage to sponsor pro-growth reforms with a maximum one point credit toward their score, and also deducted a maximum one point when legislators sponsored legislation that would restrict economic freedom.

*\* Members who received a prime sponsor credit are noted with a dagger symbol by their name (e.g. Lawmaker†). Members who received a prime sponsor demerit are noted with a double dagger symbol by their name (e.g. Lawmaker‡).*



## **SB 166- Paycheck Protection**

*State Government Committee* | AFP Position: **Support**  
*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

Paycheck Protection legislation for public employees. If enacted, SB 166 would prohibit union Political Action Committee donations from being automatically deducted from state employee paychecks on government systems. Unions would still be allowed to collect funds, but would need to use their own computer systems to do so. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **SB 181- Performance Based Budgeting**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

Performance Based Budgeting and Tax Credit Review Legislation. If enacted, SB 181 would require a schedule of performance-based budget reviews for all state agencies in partnership with the Independent Fiscal Office. The legislation also requires review of tax credits to determine whether the tax credit is accomplishing the original intent or better implemented/efficient in another way. Also establishes a Performance-Based Budget Board. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **SB 25- Nurse Scope of Practice**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

Expanding nurse scope of practice legislation. If enacted, SB 25 would allow licensed nurse practitioners to fully use all of their training and expertise without the requirement that they be overseen by a physician. Expanding the scope of practice for experienced nurse practitioners will increase Pennsylvanians' access to healthcare, help relieve healthcare provider shortages in our state, and reduce healthcare costs. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **SB 561- REINS Act**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

State REINS Act. If enacted, SB 561 would reinstate legislative power over regulations that would cost more than \$1 million to the Commonwealth, political subdivisions and private businesses. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **HB 542- Senate Budget Tax Code**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Oppose**

Senate Amended Tax Code Budget Legislation. HB 542 was amended to include nearly \$1 billion in tax increases to fund the 2017-18 General Fund budget, including reimplementing the Gross Receipts Tax on natural gas consumers, increasing the Gross Receipts Tax on electricity and telecommunications, implementation of an additional severance tax on Marcellus Shale wells, requiring third-party online vendors remit sales tax, and a new 12-percent tax on fireworks. AFP-PA opposes this legislation.

## **HB 453- Budget Non Concurrence**

*Motion to Non Concur* | AFP Position: **Oppose**

House's so-called "Taxpayer Budget" Fiscal Code funding plan for the 2017-18 General Fund budget. HB 453 was amended with the House's no-tax-increase plan to fund the already enacted general appropriations code using fund transfers from over 40 different off-line state accounts instead of increasing taxes. AFP-PA supports this legislation, but opposes the motion to non-concur.



## **HB 250- EITC/OSTC**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

Educational Improvement Tax Credit/ Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit. If enacted, HB 250 would increase the EITC to \$175 million and the OSTC to \$75 million. The EITC and OSTC allow parents to select a school other than their child's assigned school to better meet their child's educational needs. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **HB 1075- Wine and Spirit Divestiture**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

Wine and Spirit Divestiture. If enacted, HB 1075 would privatize the sale of wine and spirits in Pennsylvania, similarly to that of beer. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **HB 410- Performance Based Budgeting**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Support**

Performance-Based Budgeting legislation. If enacted, HB 410 would require performance-based budgeting measures and establishes a performance-based budget review board. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **HB 442- Plumbing License**

*Final Passage* | AFP Position: **Oppose**

Licensure for plumbers. If enacted, HB 442 would create a plumbing board and require apprentice, journeyman and master plumbers to get permission from the government before doing their job, making it harder for those trying to enter the field or start a plumbing business. AFP-PA opposes this legislation.

## **HB 453- Budget Funding Fiscal Code**

*Concur* | AFP Position: **Support**

House's "Taxpayers' Budget" Fiscal Code plan to fund the 2017-18 General Fund budget. HB 453 was amended with the House's no-tax-increase plan to fund the already enacted general appropriations code using fund transfers from over 40 different off-line state accounts instead of increasing taxes. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

## **HB 113- Severance Tax Discharge Resolution**

*Discharge* | AFP Position: **Oppose**

Discharge Resolution on Marcellus Shale severance Tax. This procedural vote is a de facto vote to implement a severance tax on the Marcellus Shale industry.
