SCORING METHODOLOGY

Scores on the AFP-Illinois Scorecard are calculated using the following formula:

FOR BILLS AFP SUPPORTED:

AYE Vote = 1 Points

NAY Vote = 0 Point

NV (*Not Voting*) = 0.1 Points

NA (*Not a Member of the Legislature when the Vote was Taken, Not Assigned to the Relevant Committee, or Absent Due to Military Service*) = Not factored

FOR BILLS AFP OPPOSED:

AYE Vote = 0 Points

NAY Vote = 1 Point

Prime Sponsor Credits

Legislators who sponsored aligned priority legislation were awarded an additional point. Similarly, points were deducted from the scores of legislators who sponsored unaligned legislation.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO PROTECT EARNED PENSIONS | HJRCA 21

Rep. Mazzochi

Amends the pension clause of the Illinois Constitution to recognize a distinction between accrued, or “past,” benefits earned and future benefit accruals.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO PROTECT EARNED PENSIONS | SJRCA 9

Sen. Weaver

Amends the pension clause of the Illinois Constitution to recognize a distinction between accrued, or “past,” benefits earned and future benefit accruals.

TRUE BALANCED BUDGET AMENDMENT | HJRCA 27

Rep. Andrade

Would categorically limit state spending to match state revenue each fiscal year. It also would prohibit counting debt, refinancing or fund sweeps as revenue.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT TRANSPARENCY | HB 2810

Rep. Moeller

Enhances government transparency by requiring local governments to make a diverse amount of information publicly accessible on their websites.

SCHOOL DISTRICT CONSOLIDATION/ EFFICIENCY COMMISSION | HB 3053

Rep. Mayfield

Creates the School District Efficiency Commission to make recommendations of school district reorganization and realignment. Places adopted school district reorganization proposals on the ballot.

PROGRESSIVE TAX | SJRCA 1

Sen. Harmon

Proposes to amend the Illinois Constitution by removing a flat tax regulation and eliminating a “no more than one such tax” protection. Will be voted on in the November 2020 election.

RAIN TAX | HB 825

Rep. DeLuca

Allows non-home rule municipalities to impose a “rain tax” to maintain their stormwater sewer system.

STREAMING AND SATELLITE TAX | HB 3359

Rep. Turner

Imposes a levy, a one-percent tax on streaming service users “for the privilege to witness, view, or otherwise enjoy the entertainment” while also imposing a five-percent tax on streaming companies’ gross revenues.

GRADUATED INCOME TAX RATES | SB 687

Sen. Hutchinson

Establishes a rate schedule for a graduated income tax in the state of Illinois, should a constitutional amendment be adopted in 2020. Rates would go from a 4.95 percent flat rate to a 6 tier progressive rate structure from 4.75–7.99 percent. Increases corporate income tax rate from 7 to 7.99 percent. Net tax increase of \$3.4 billion.

PLASTIC BAG TAX | SB 1240

Sen. Link

Creates a new 7 cents per plastic bag tax imposed statewide, except for Chicago. 2 cents per bag would go to the retailer, 2 cents per bag to the state’s general fund, and 3 cents to a new state Checkout Bag Tax Fund.

LOCAL RIGHT TO WORK BAN | SB 1474

Sen. Villivalem

Authorizes the General Assembly to exclusively hold the authority to enact any legislation, ordinance, rule, or regulation that prohibits, restricts, or regulates the use of union agreements between an employer and labor organization. Bans local right to work.

BUDGET TAX HIKES | SB 689

Sen. Hutchinson

Contains revenues corresponding with the Illinois FY 2020 unbalanced budget.

BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION ACT FY 2020 | SB 1814

Sen. Steans

The FY 2020 BIMP—Budget Implementation Bill—which is unbalanced and includes revenue from new tax hikes.

OPERATING APPROPRIATIONS & SPENDING FY 2020 | SB 262

Sen. J. Cullerton

Authorizes FY 2020 operating appropriations/spending. Budget is unbalanced and includes revenue from new tax hikes.

CAPITOL BUDGET TAX HIKES (GAS TAX & VEHICLE FEES) | SB 1939

Sen. Sandoval

Raise gas tax from 19 cents per gallon to 38 cents per gallon, indexed to inflation. Hikes annual vehicle registration fees from \$98 to \$148. Allows for additional local gas taxes at the municipal and county levels.

VERTICAL BUDGET TAX HIKES (GAMING, CIGARETTE TAX HIKE, PARKING) | SB 690

Rep. Harris

Increases taxes on cigarettes, vaping, parking garages. Expands gambling opportunities including increasing the number of casinos, legalizes sports betting. Increases video gaming taxes.

CONSTRUCTION APPROPRIATIONS/SPENDING | HB 62

Rep. Harris

Capital bill appropriations spend. Paid for with higher gasoline taxes and other taxes and fees.

MINIMUM WAGE HIKE | SB 1

Sen. Lightford

A minimum wage hike bill, that will eventually get the minimum wage to \$15/hour January 1st, 2025. \$9.25/hour January 1, 2020.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM

RAISING RETAIL THEFT FELONY THRESHOLD | HB 1614

Rep. Slaughter

Raises the felony retail theft and theft threshold (from \$300 and \$500) to \$2,000. This bill mirrors recommendations from bipartisan the 2017 Illinois State Commission on Criminal Justice and Sentencing Reform, commissioned by former Governor Rauner to reduce prison overpopulation.

RETROACTIVE PENALTY REDUCTION | HB 2039

Rep. Cassidy

Allows individuals to retroactively clear their record of activities society no longer believes should be illegal or for which penalties have been reduced.

LICENSE TO WORK ACT | HB 3052

Rep. Ammons

Prevents the suspension of drivers licenses for many non-moving violations including parking tickets.

LICENSE TO WORK ACT | SB 1786

Sen. Aquino

Prevents the suspension of drivers licenses for many non-moving violations including parking tickets

MISDEMEANOR RETAIL THEFT AND THEFT DIVERSIONARY PROGRAM | SB 1878

Sen. Plummer

Allows a previously unconvicted defendant to participate in the Misdemeanor Retail Theft and Theft Diversionary Program. Allows for dismissal of the case upon successful fulfillment of the program.

CANNABIS LEGALIZATION AND EXPUNGEMENT BILL | HB 1438

Rep. Cassidy

Allows for the legal cultivation, sale, and possession of cannabis in regulated amounts statewide. Expunges nearly 800,000 prior low level cannabis possession offenses.

K-12 EDUCATION

ABOLISH CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION | HB 2100

Rep. Welch

Abolishes the Illinois State Charter School Commission, which hears appeals from those denied by local school districts the permission to start a charter school.

ABOLISH CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION | SB 1226

Sen. Holmes

Abolishes the Illinois State Charter School Commission, which hears appeals from those denied by local school districts the permission to start a charter school.
