TAXPAYER SCORECARD

AFP's Taxpayer Scorecard is our good faith effort to inform citizens about the performance of their elected representatives. There is no better barometer by which to measure lawmakers' allegiance to fiscal responsibility, economic freedom, and breaking down barriers so every Tennessean can live the American Dream than to evaluate their votes on important legislation. Simply put, their votes are their record.

Of course, no legislative scorecard can take into consideration every bill affecting taxpayers. Each of Americans for Prosperity-Tennessee's (AFP-TN) legislative priorities is included on this scorecard, as well as any additional issues we communicated support for or opposition to during the regular session.

TAXPAYER SCORECARD GRADING OVERVIEW

Each legislator is scored based on the legislative votes they took. All votes scored are key votes - legislators were notified in writing of our stance. Two points are awarded for prime sponsorship and one point for co-sponsorship of scored votes. Any sponsorship of a bill will count as a vote in favor of the legislation, if the member does not have the opportunity to vote on the item.

For example, justice reform and educational freedom were our top legislative priorities, therefore votes and sponsorship of these** bills are weighted. Each sponsorship for or against key voted legislation triggers a bonus point or demerit added to the final score, respectively.

1** Educational Freedom / Education Savings Accounts HB 939 / SB 795

Result: Public Chapter 506 | **Sponsors: Sen. Johnson / Rep. Lamberth**CoSponsors: Dunn, Casada, White, Holt, Kumar, Powers, Smith, Helton / Gresham, Kelsey

Every child should have access to a quality education. The Tennessee Education Savings Account Pilot Program will give eligible parents of children trapped in a failing K-12 school district (Shelby & Davidson Counties) up to \$7300 to pay for tuition, textbooks, transportation, or uniforms for private or charter schools. Ideally, this legislation could be expanded in the future to let education dollars follow the child in whatever schooling option their parents deem the best fit.

2 School Funding | HB 2001 / SB 1962

Result: Public Chapter 576 | **Sponsors: Sen. Gresham / Rep. White** CoSponsors: Smith, Hardaway, Bricken, Terry

Many school boards will pass a budget in excess of funding needed to operate and upkeep public schools. This bill will make school boards adhere to revenue projections in budget procedures to prevent local tax hikes or spending growth in excess of tax revenue.

3 Driver's License Restoration | HB 839/ SB 1143

Result: Public Chapter 438 | Sponsors: Sen. Akbari / Rep. Lamberth

This common-sense policy enables Tennesseans with suspended licenses over unpaid debts to enter into a payment plan unique to their financial situation and pay what is owed over time while still being able to drive to work or school on a restricted license. The bill maintains accountability by requiring timely payments and emphasizing that after 30 days of non-payment, a license will be suspended. Once the individual's court costs, fines, and fees are paid in full their regular driver's license is restored.

4 Drug Free Zone Reforms | HB 2517 / SB 2734

This bill reforms Tennessee's harsh drug free zone laws by reducing the zones from 1000^{ft} to 500^{ft} and giving judges discretion on whether an enhancement is appropriate. The previous law forced judges to deliver sentences that far exceeded the severity of a crime, wasting state resources. This legislation is anticipated to save taxpayers \$18,449,900.

5 Citation in Lieu of Arrest | HB 715 / SB 587

Result: Public Chapter 316 | Sponsors: Sen. Lundberg / Rep. Faison

Gives law enforcement officers additional discretion to give a citation in lieu of arrest for low-level, non-violent misdemeanor offenses.

6 Expungements / Second Chances | HB 941 / SB 797

Result: Public Chapter 200 | Sponsors: Sen. Johnson / Rep. Lamberth

Removes state expungement fees ranging from \$180 - \$350. This financial barrier prevented people from truly having a second chance.

7 Voting Rights Restoration | HB 547 / SB 589

Result: Passed House / Senate did not vote on bill | Sponsors: Sen. Dickerson / Rep. Curcio

Allows for the provisional restoration of voting rights if someone has completed their sentence AND did not commit an offense that results in a life-time ban from voting. Any unpaid fines, fees, victim's restitution, or child support must be satisfied with a current payment plan in order to obtain provisional voting restoration.

8 Direct Medical Care | HB 1867 / SB 2317

Direct Medical Care can dramatically increase access to health care services by allowing all licensed health care providers to enter into contracts with patients. Providers offering a month-to-month payment for services would not be considered insurers. Removing these regulations and red tape will allow Tennesseans greater access to dentistry and health care for a lower cost, even if they are uninsured.

9 Certificate of Need Repeal / Reforms | HB 2350 / SB 2312

Result: Failed to reach agreement in Conference committee, Different versions passed each chamber | **Sponsors:** Sen. Gardenhire / Rep. Smith, Speaker Sexton

Certificate-of-Need (CON) laws impose arbitrary, bureaucratic regulations that block new hospitals and other health care facilities from being opened or expanding services without permission from the government. CON's allow for existing providers to secretly block others from entering the service area, creating a monopoly that leaves Tennesseans with less access and higher costs for health care, particularly in rural areas. This bill would have repealed numerous CON laws, reformed the entire process for the remaining CONs, cutting costs and the time to obtain a CON in half, and made competitor's objections public.

10 Telemedicine* / Telehealth | HB 1699 / SB 1892

Result: Passed House; Senate did not take up final version; if a special session is called this bill may be heard and receive final passage | Sponsors: Sen. Art Swann, Sen. Paul Bailey / Rep. Smith, Speaker Sexton

The Telemedicine bill would allow Tennesseans to virtually access their health care provider from any place they deem fit. While the service would be covered as an office visit through insurance, it is an option that would be decided between the provider and patient if a telemedicine appointment would be appropriate for a simple, or follow-up visit.

11 FACTS ACT - Government Transparency for ECD | HB 1265 / SB513

Loop-holes in the accountability process for tax incentives has been an ongoing issue. The Fair, Accountable, & Clarity in Tax Subsidies (FACTS) Act will: 1. Require at least 80% of the jobs promised to be delivered for the full credit 2. Remove Commissioner discretion to waive the claw-back provisions unless the business is located in an economically distressed county.

12 ECD Reporting / Transparency | HB 2156 / SB 2111

Result: Public Chapter TBD | Sponsors: Sen. Lundberg / Rep. Boyd

This bill requires the Economic and Community Development (ECD) department to report claw-back rights enacted when tax incentives given do not meet the requirements.

13 Freedom to Braid | HB 320 / SB 1185

Result: Public Chapter 207 | Sponsors: Sen. White / Rep. Littleton

CoSponsors: Gresham

Exempts a person who engages in hair braiding from the cosmetologist licensure requirements, if health / safety training is obtained.

Result: Public Chapter TBD. Constitutional Amendments must pass the next General Assembly with a 2/3 vote before being placed on the state-wide ballot in 2022 | **Sponsors: Sen. Kelsey / Rep. Smith**

Enshrines Right-To-Work in our state constitution, which will protect Tennesseans from being denied employment based on union membership or lack thereof.

16 TN Public Participation Act | HB 777/ SB 1097

Result: Public Chapter 185 | Sponsors: Sen. Dickerson / Rep. Ramsey

CoSponsors: Kumar, Jernigan, Hardaway, Daniel, Lafferty, Thompson, Rudd / Stevens, Yarbro

Strategic lawsuits against public participation (SLAPP) are lawsuits filed to chill free speech and force people to spend time and money in court defending themselves against frivolous charges over something as simple as a Yelp review or Facebook comment. This bill made it easier for judges to quickly review and dismiss these cases while holding those responsible for filing the frivolous suit liable for attorney costs and sanctions.

17 Judicial Review | HJR 140

Result: Enacted | Sponsors: Sen. Kelsey / Rep. Daniel

This bill would urge state and federal courts to refrain from applying judicial deference to state administrative agencies for their interpretation of statues and regulations.
