

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## SCORING METHODOLOGY

One point has been awarded for each vote cast in support of an issue that removes barriers for society or against an issue that creates new barriers. Each vote carries the same weight, regardless of the issue, or whether the vote occurred in committee or on the floor.

Legislators voting on an issue twice and voting in favor of our position both times received a score of 2/2. If they voted against our position both times they received a score of 0/2. We also awarded one point for prime sponsorship of a priority bill we supported.

# BILL DESCRIPTIONS

## HB 333 | SMALL BUSINESS TAX PACKAGE

*Rep. Eric Nelson*

House Bill 333 addresses a distortion in the Pennsylvania tax code, allowing expensing for corporations, but not passthrough businesses. This legislation would align the tax code to encourage the small businesses' investment by allowing the full tax deduction for equipment under section 179 of the federal tax code.

## HB 1316 | TAXPAYER PROTECTION ACT

*Rep. Ryan Warner*

This bill proposes an amendment to the state constitution, which will install a significant spending reform to ensure the state does not grow government spending unchecked. This amendment would limit annual increases in state spending. The cap in spending growth would account for factors like inflation and population growth, ensuring that the state will have the resources to continue providing its important core functions while also protecting taxpayer dollars.

## HB 800 | EDUCATIONAL IMPROVEMENT TAX CREDIT EXPANSION

*Rep. Mike Turzai*

This bill would increase the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) by \$100 million and establish an automatic annual escalator for the program's funding.

## HB 356 | CHARTER SCHOOL REFORM PACKAGE: CHARTER SCHOOL BUILDINGS

*Rep. Matthew Dowling*

This bill would make it easier for charter schools to acquire new facilities by providing charter schools the right of first refusal to public school property or sale.

## HB 357 | CHARTER SCHOOL REFORM PACKAGE: STANDARD CHARTER APPLICATION

*Rep. Jesse Topper*

This would create a uniform application process for a charter school with the Department of Education.

## HB 358 | CHARTER SCHOOL REFORM PACKAGE: PER PUPIL FUNDING AND CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

*Rep. Jim Marshall*

This would allow charter school and vocational-technical students to dual enroll in higher education institutions.

## HB 1841 | LAW ENFORCEMENT BACKGROUND INVESTIGATIONS

*Rep. Harry Readshaw*

This bill improves the ability for law enforcement leaders to secure quality candidates and prevent the uninformed hiring of candidates who have previously



engaged in unethical or illegal conduct. It requires law enforcement agencies to retain certain disciplinary records, report records related to an officer's dismissal in a state-run database, and review such records before hiring former officers for a new role.

## HB 1910 | MANDATORY CHILD ABUSE RECOGNITION TRAINING & POLICE MENTAL HEALTH EVALUATION

*Rep. Dan Williams*

This bill equips police officers with additional training that will help them recognize child abuse, interact with individuals suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder, and implement proper de-escalation tactics. It also requires law enforcement agencies to complete a mental health evaluation upon request of an officer or police agency 30 days after the use of lethal force.

## SB 14 | COMPREHENSIVE PROBATION REFORM

*Sen. Anthony Williams*

This bill provides incentives that reward positive behavior under community supervision and also allows for potential early release from probation by incentivizing probationers to participate in educational, vocational, and/or drug treatment programming that has been shown to reduce recidivism. Additionally, the bill will help reduce unnecessary revocations for technical violations and ensures that in revocation hearings, courts use sufficiently high evidence standards, give defendants access to counsel, and adopt a presumption that other combinations of supervision conditions or treatment should be considered before a return to prison is ordered.

# BILL DESCRIPTIONS

## **SB 459 | LAW ENFORCEMENT USE OF FORCE**

*Sen. Jay Costa*

The bill would require the recording and reporting on use-of-force incidents by all law enforcement agencies and require annual report of aggregate data about uses-of-force, including those involving death or serious bodily injury, to certain legislative and executive officials.

## **HB 111 | MERIT SELECTION**

*Rep. Paul Schemel*

House Bill 111 creates an independent commission to determine eligibility for appellate and Supreme Court vacancies in Pennsylvania. The individuals appointed to this commission will select five proposed candidates for the Governor's selection. That selection will then have to be confirmed by a two-thirds vote of the Pennsylvania Senate.

## **SB 500 | JUSTICE REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE 2**

*Sen. Lisa Baker*

This bill created a state advisory committee to study and advise county probation and parole departments on the use of evidence-based practices and assessing the risks and needs of participants. The bill also created a grant program funded by savings from Pennsylvania's Justice Reinvestment Initiative package to help county probation and parole departments adopt evidence-based practices and improve the supervision of high-risk individuals. It also appropriated portions of these savings to improve crime victim compensation and ensure proper implementation of the state's new sentencing risk assessment instrument.

## **SB 501 | JUSTICE REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE 2**

*Sen. Tom Killon*

Among other reforms, this bill gives judges more flexibility to impose probation as an alternative to incarceration during sentencing and equips them with evidence based guidelines that advise them on the sentence which maximizes public safety. The bill also expanded access to drug treatment and strengthens the state's parole and probation programs. Lastly, it also requires the Pennsylvania Sentencing Commission to report data and information on various justice system functions, including implementation of recent reforms, outcome metrics, and cost savings.

## **SB 502 | JUSTICE REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE 2**


*Sen. Camera Bartolotta*

In addition to improving communication between law enforcement and victims of crime, this bill would expand eligibility for victim losses compensation, and merges two separate victim compensation programs into one department that will better serve victims.

## **HB 1555 | PROBATION REFORM**

*Rep. Sheryl Delozier*

HB 1555 would have reformed Pennsylvania's probation system by requiring mandatory reviews of an individual's probation conditions after serving certain periods of time under supervision and limiting the use of incarceration for technical violations of probation conditions.



## **HB 440 | EXPUNGEMENT UPON PARDON OR FULL ACQUITTAL**

*Rep. Tedd Nesbit*

House Bill 440 ensures that Pennsylvanians who have been pardoned or fully acquitted of their charges can secure a streamlined, automatic expungement process. Someone who is legally innocent or pardoned should not continue to face the high barrier posed by a criminal record to accessing housing, employment, and education.

## **HB 2438 | IMPROVING BROADBAND ACCESS**

*Rep. Clint Owlett*

This bill removes regulatory barriers and makes it easier for Pennsylvanians to access high-speed internet by allowing electric cooperatives to provide broadband services

through their existing infrastructure and to utilize existing easements for that purpose. It eliminates the need for electric co-ops to negotiate with each property owner with land adjoining an easement before attaching broadband equipment to their existing infrastructure. It also protects property rights by making an exception for free-standing easements that might impair someone's property.

## **SB 613 | EMERGENCY MITIGATION PLAN FOR BUSINESS**

*Sen. Bob Mensch*

This bill would require the governor to develop a plan, adhering to federal guidelines related to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, to allow certain employers to reopen their businesses and get workers back to work within the ensuing three weeks.

## **SB 327 | COUNTY BASED COVID-19 MITIGATION**

*Sen. David Argall*

The bill would give Pennsylvania county governments the option to develop and implement their plans to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, following CISA guidelines. Under the bill, businesses already identified as essential could continue to operate, and counties would also be given the authority to develop plans to allow other industries to operate if it is safe to do so.

# BILL DESCRIPTIONS

## SB 25 | SCOPE OF PRACTICE

*Sen. Camera Bartolotta*

This bill would allow licensed nurse practitioners to fully use all of their training and expertise without the requirement that a physician oversee them. Expanding the scope of practice for experienced nurse practitioners will increase Pennsylvanians' access to healthcare, help relieve healthcare provider shortages in our state, and reduce healthcare costs.

## HB 100 | NURSING SCOPE OF PRACTICE PILOT PROGRAM

*Rep. Jesse Tapper*

This bill was intended to create a pilot program allowing nurse practitioners who complete a minimum of 3,600 hours of clinical experience to freely practice to the full extent of their training and expertise in communities facing a shortage of health care providers.

## SB 857 | TELEMEDICINE

*Sen. Elder Vogel*

This bill would allow health care providers to practice store-and-forward and remote patient monitoring telehealth and allow licensed out-of-state health care providers to practice in Pennsylvania if they meet certain conditions. It also allowed Medicaid to reimburse for store-and-forward and remote patient monitoring telehealth.

## HB 430 | REGULATORY REPEAL THROUGH RESOLUTION

*Rep. Kerry Benninghoff*

Grants the General Assembly the ability to repeal current regulations in effect with a concurrent resolution. Currently, the General Assembly only has the authority to block the implementation of new rules and regulations. This legislation would extend this process to regulations that are already in effect.

## HB 509 | PERMITTING REFORM

*Rep. Greg Rothman*

Reforms the administration of permits in the Commonwealth by requiring the creation of an online tracking system for permit applications to provide updates in the status of permits and requires more information to be provided on permits in annual reports.

## HB 762 | REGULATORY COMPLIANCE OFFICER

*Rep. Tim O'Neal*

Requires state agencies to appoint a Regulatory Compliance Advisor. The advisor is charged to work with regulators and businesses to issue advisory opinions on how to comply with regulations helping businesses avoid costly fees, fines, and penalties.



## HB 806 | REINS ACT

*Rep. Dawn Keefer*

Requires the General Assembly to approve regulations that have an impact of more than \$1,000,000 annually.

## HB 1055 | OFFICE OF THE REPEALER

*Rep. Kate Klunk*

Creates an independent Office of the Repeater to review existing regulations and implements a 2-out-1-in standard for new rules.

## HB 1477 | OCCUPATIONAL LICENSURE REFORM

*Rep. Sheryl Delozier*

House Bill 1477 requires that boards, commissions, or departments of the Commonwealth apply a standard set of rules when considering whether to deny, suspend, or revoke a license based on a criminal conviction. The bill

would also require that boards only withhold a license for convictions which are directly related to the practice of the occupation. If so, the boards should consider the nature of the offense, the amount of time that has passed since the conviction, evidence of the applicant's fitness to practice the occupation, and other relevant factors before withholding a license.

## SB 398 | REGULATORY REVIEW ACT

*Sen. John Gordner*

This bill is designed to give the General Assembly more oversight over the regulatory process. The bill requires proposed regulatory language to be immediately provided to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission and the relevant legislative committee the same day. It also provides a framework for the relevant legislative committee to review, dispute, and delay the implementation of proposed regulation if there are concerns with the impact of proposed regulations.

# BILL DESCRIPTIONS

## HB 785 | EMPLOYEE RIGHTS NOTIFICATION

*Rep. Kate Klunk*

This bill provides for notification of public employees of their right to not pay any money to a union without their consent, as well as notification to applicants for public sector jobs, that they may choose whether or not to join a union or to pay funds to any organization that they did not consent to support.

## HB 995 | PILOT REGULATORY REDUCTION PROGRAM

*Rep. Andrew Lewis*

This bill provides a pilot program for “red tape” reduction at the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole and the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs by 25 percent. After the pilot program, the state would assess the outcomes and make recommendations on how the program could be replicated in other executive branch agencies.



## SB 5 | LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ECONOMICALLY SIGNIFICANT REGULATIONS

*Sen. John DiSanto*

This bill would require the General Assembly to approve all regulations with an economic impact or cost to the Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, and the private sector exceeding \$1 million.

## SB 609 | AUTOMATIC ONE-TIME REVIEW OF ECONOMICALLY SIGNIFICANT REGULATIONS

*Sen. Michele Brooks*

This bill would provide a one-time automatic review of all “economically significant” regulations established after the effective date of the bill’s enactment, defined as regulations that have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, or the private sector that exceeds \$1 million annually. After the regulation has been in effect for three years, the agency promulgating the regulation must review it and

then report to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC).

The IRRC will then collect public comments on the submitted report for no less than thirty days. Within thirty days of the public comment period’s conclusion, determine whether the regulation is still in the public interest and whether statutory changes should be considered.

agencies for repeal, modification or revision. The bill would also implement a one-in, two-out model for new regulations and include a sunset date of five years to ensure the Office of the Repealer can properly review all regulations and make necessary recommendations.

## SB 252 | TRANSPARENCY IN PERMITTING

*Sen. Kristin Phillips-Hill*

This bill would require all agencies which issue permits to increase transparency throughout the process by requiring those agencies to post information about the permits that they grant on their website; to create an accessible tracking system for applicants to check the status of their applications; to clearly state the legal authority that the agency relies on when rejecting a permit application and to assign a contact person to answer questions about the application process.

## SB 119 | INVENTORY AND REDUCE REGULATIONS

*Sen. John DiSanto*

This bill orders a six-month review of the Pennsylvania Code to determine the number of current regulatory mandates in Pennsylvania. The final list will be consolidated and publicized on the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) website. The bill also implements a one-in, two-out model for new regulations—for every new regulation added, two must be repealed. After six years, the bill sunsets one-in, two-out and moves to a one-in, one-out system.

## SB 253 | REGULATORY COMPLIANCE OFFICER

*Sen. Kristin Phillips-Hill*

This bill would require that each agency designate an employee as the agency’s regulatory compliance officer. This officer would be tasked with being accessible to the regulated community and working with them to explain regulations and resolve noncompliance issues before imposing penalties. The bill also contains a safe harbor provision allowing an individual or business to request an advisory opinion from the compliance officer regarding the requester’s duties under a regulation, thus protecting the requester when acting in reliance on any advice provided.


