

LEGISLATIVE VOTE EXPLANATIONS

- SB 53** **Modifies provisions relating to the administration of justice** **AFP Position: ✓**
 Sponsors: Sen. Tony Luetkemeyer
 Senate Bill 53 contained several provisions which reform our justice system. SB 53 prohibits law enforcement from using chokeholds, unless in defense. It further reduces requirements for the expungement of some records, allowing Missourians who have served their time to return to the workforce and become productive citizens. The act also establishes programs to give alternative forms of sentencing to parents with a nonviolent offense, keeping families together and working. It also prohibits officers from engaging in sexual conduct with detainees or prisoners. Finally, SB 53 protects the dignity of women and prison by providing feminine hygiene products. **Scored: House and Senate votes**
- SB 262** **Modifies provisions relating to transportation** **AFP Position: ✗**
 Sponsors: Sen. Dave Schatz
 SB 262 increases the Missouri Fuel tax from 17 cents to 29.5 cents per gallon. It does this by increasing the rate by 2.5 cents over the next five years, bypassing the state's Hancock Amendment. It further increases the Alternative Fuel Decal fee by 20% per year for five years. Missourians are eligible for a refund of the increase of the gas tax if they keep records of their purchases and submit a claim for reimbursement on their taxes. Missourians are required to save their records or three years. **Scored: House and Senate votes**
- HA 8 to HB 10** **Expansion of Medicaid** **AFP Position: ✗**
 Sponsors: Rep. Betsy Fogle
 HA 8 to HB 10 was an attempt to add Medicaid expansion funding to the Missouri budget. **Scored: House vote**
- HA 5 to HB 5** **Expansion of Medicaid** **AFP Position: ✗**
 Sponsors: Rep. Betsy Fogle
 HA 5 to HB 5 was an attempt to add Medicaid expansion funding to the Missouri budget. **Scored: House vote**
- HB 529** **Establishes a minimum biodiesel fuel content mandate for diesel fuel sold or offered for sale in Missouri** **AFP Position: ✗**
 Sponsors: Rep. Mike Haffner
 HB 529 would have forced all diesel fuel sold to contain 20% biodiesel fuel oil by 2026. This is a mandate that picks and chooses winners over others, mandating Missourians purchase a product regardless of their desire and need to do so. Instead, Missourians should have the ability to purchase the fuel that best fits their needs. **Scored: House vote**
- HB 1030** **Creates the Personal Privacy Protection Act** **AFP Position: ✓**
 Sponsors: Rep. Jerad Taylor
 HB 1030 created protections for personal privacy by prohibiting government agencies from disclosing themselves, or requiring the disclosure, of personal information related to the donations Missourians make to private organizations like churches and charities. **Scored: House vote**
- HB 475** **Modifies provisions relating to the professional registration of dietitians** **AFP Position: ✓**
 Sponsors: Rep. Derek Grier
 This bill allows any person to disseminate free literature or provide individualized nutrition assessment, guidance, encouragement, recommendations, or weight control services as to the use of food, food materials or dietary supplements without a dietitian license, as long as the person does not hold himself or herself out as a dietitian. **Scored: House vote**
- HB 495** **Modifies provisions relating to telemedicine** **AFP Position: ✓**
 Sponsors: Rep. Becky Ruth
 HB 495 increased the availability of affordable health care to Missourians by allowing a relationship to be started with a physician, to be used for telehealth care, via a form provided and filled out online. **Scored: House vote**
- SA 1 to SB 36** **A provision to decrease the income tax** **AFP Position: ✓**
 Sponsors: Rep. Bill Eigel
 SA 1 to SB 36 would decrease Missouri's income tax by .1% each year net general revenue if the state exceeds a baseline net general revenue and for every 100 hundred million of excess revenue. **Scored: Senate vote**
- SA 1 to SA 1 to HB 10** **Expansion of Medicaid** **AFP Position: ✗**
 Sponsors: Sen. John Rizzo
 SA 1 to SA 1 to HB 10 was an attempt to add Medicaid expansion funding to the Missouri budget. **Scored: Senate vote**
- SB 283** **Modifies provisions relating to liquor sales** **AFP Position: ✓**
 Sponsors: Sen. Denny Hoskins
 SB 283 allowed for the sale of "to-go" alcohol by retailers and restaurants that were mixed and filled on sight to be consumed off-premises, as long as the alcohol was packaged in an appropriate container with proper sealing. **Scored: Senate vote**
