The Americans for Prosperity-Kansas 2021 Legislative Scorecard represents legislation from the chapter's priority initiatives including, economic opportunity, education, health care, energy, and criminal justice reform.

SCORING METHODOLOGY

Scores on the AFP-Kansas Scorecard are calculated using the following formula.

FOR BILLS APP SUPPORTED:

AYE Vote = 1 Points

NAY Vote = 0 Point

Present not voting = 0 Point

Absent = NA

Non votes and absences were not calculated for or against the member's score, as there is not a method for assuming intent or extenuating circumstances.

FOR BILLS APP OPPOSED:

AYE Vote = 0 Points

NAY Vote = 1 Point

Present not voting = 0.5 Point

Absent = NA

GRADES ARE ASSIGNED ACCORDING TO THE FOLLOWING SCALE:

A+ = 100% or Greater

A = 90-99%

B = 80-89%

C = 70-79%

D = 60-69%

F = 59% or Less

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

DRIVERS LICENSE SUSPENSION FEES & FINES

SB 127

Expands access to restricted driving privileges for individuals whose driver's license was suspended for a mere failure to pay court debt or properly respond to a court notice. Reforms will also remove burdensome fees that prevent certain individuals from securing restricted driving privileges and allow a court to waive any fine or fee for individuals who cannot truly afford them.

OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING RECOGNITION

HB 2066

Expands the military spouse and service member's expedited licensure law to all applicants who have established or intend to establish residency in Kansas. (Substitute: Substitutes for HB 2066 by Committee on Commerce, Labor, and Economic Development).

LIQUOR LICENSING FOR BUSINESSES | HB 2212

Makes Kansas compliant with SCOTUS decision on business licensing and residency requirement.

ENERGY CHOICE ACT | SB 24

Prohibits municipalities from imposing restrictions on customer's use of energy based upon source of energy.

SHORT TERM HEALTH INSURANCE PLANS

SB 199

Allows short term health insurance plans to be extended for up to 36 months, giving consumers more affordable options.

MENTAL TELEHEALTH EXPANSION AND LICENSING RECIPROCITY | HB 2208

Authorizes out-of-state physicians to practice telehealth in Kansas after receiving a waiver from the board of health. The bill would require the board to issue a waiver after receiving a completed application within 15 days and limit the fee to \$100.

MENTAL TELEHEALTH EXPANSION AND LICENSING RECIPROCITY | SB 238

Authorizes out-of-state physicians to practice telehealth in Kansas after receiving a waiver from the board of health. The bill would require the board to issue a waiver after receiving a completed application within 15 days and limit the fee to \$100.

MEDEX EXPANSION AMENDMENT | HB 2397

Harms taxpayers and crowds out traditional and disabled Medicaid enrollees, and private health insurance coverage, in favor of able-bodied childless adults.

EXPANSION OF EDUCATIONAL FREEDOM

HB 2119

Expands educational options for parents and families with at-risk children, allowing for more flexibility and opportunity in education through educational freedom programming.

TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP EXPANSION

SB 61

Expands student eligibility for the state's education choice program, known as the Tax Credit for Low Income Students Scholarship, to include all students who qualify for free and reduced-price lunch, instead of limiting participation to only students in the lowest 100 performing schools.

EDUCATIONAL FREEDOM | SB 175

Enacts educational freedom and opportunity for parents and families with at-risk children, allowing for increased flexibility and opportunity.

KANSAS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT

SB 40

Prescribes powers, duties and functions of the board of education of each school district, the governing body of each community college and the governing body of each technical college related to the COVID-19 health emergency, adding the vice president of the senate to the legislative coordinating council, modifying the procedure for the declaration and extension of a state of disaster emergency under the Kansas emergency management act. This prohibits certain actions by the governor related to the COVID-19 health emergency and revokes all executive orders related to such emergency on March 31, 2021, establishing judicial review for certain executive orders issued during a state of disaster emergency and certain actions taken by a local unit of government during a state of local disaster emergency. The legislature or the legislative coordinating council is authorized to revoke certain orders issued by the secretary of health and environment and limiting powers granted to local health officers related to certain orders.



BILL DESCRIPTIONS

EXPANSION OF STAR BONDS | SB 124

Creates corporate welfare program for land developers, picking winners and losers in the market with taxpayer money and little transparency.

TAX DECOUPLING | SB 50

Requires marketplace facilitators to collect and remit sales, use and transient guest taxes and 911 fees from sales made through their platforms and to remove click-through nexus provisions. This bill was successfully overridden for decoupling legislation.

TRUTH IN TAXATION FOR PROPERTY TAX | SB 13

Establishes notice and public hearing requirements prior to approval by a governing body to exceed its revenue neutral rate for property tax purposes and discontinuing the city and county tax lid, prohibiting valuation increase of real property solely as the result of regular repair, replacement, or maintenance of the existing structure and establishing a payment plan for the payment of delinquent or nondelinquent property taxes. This provides transparency and accountability to the process.

SHORT TERM HEALTH INSURANCE PLANS SB 29 CCR

Allowing for the extension of Short-Term Health Insurance plans to 36 months, consistent with Federal policy


Opposes federal HR 1 and SB 1

TAX DECOUPLING | SB 22

Provides income tax modifications for global intangible low-taxed income, business interest, capital contributions, FDIC premiums, business meals, and payment protection program loans and expenses; expanding the expense deduction availability to income tax taxpayers and calculating the deduction amount; allowing an individual to itemize deductions in Kansas despite not itemizing on their federal return; exempting from income compensation attributable to unemployment insurance ID fraud; and increasing the net operating loss for corporations. This prevents an unintended tax hike on Kansans.

URGING THE KANSAS GOVERNOR TO END FEDERAL PANDEMIC UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION IN SUPPORT OF KANSAS BUSINESSES | SB 1616

This vote highlighted the need to remove disincentives to work so that the Kansas economy can recover better and stronger. We do not support borrowing from the federal government as this adds pressure for federal bailouts of unemployment funds and/or increased payroll taxes at the state level to replenish unemployment funds. Businesses should not have to compete with the government in order to stay afloat.
