ABOUT THE **TAXPAYER SCORECARD**

Each year Americans for Prosperity-Oklahoma engages in legislative advocacy to promote free markets and limited government. 2021 was an outstanding legislative session for these principles and our legislative scorecard is a way for us to document those successes and share with you how your elected officials voted in key policy areas. If something in this scorecard is of particular interest to you, please do not hesitate to contact your AFP-Oklahoma team to learn more.

SCORING METHODOLOGY

There are many ways an individual could describe the making of public policy and how a particular legislative session unfolded. We believe the most simple and effective way to tell that story is through the votes themselves. Here's how the scoring system works. Points can be earned in two ways. Lawmakers who voted for legislation supported by AFP are awarded one point and do not receive a point for voting against those bills (and vice versa) on bills opposed by AFP. Sponsoring bills supported by AFP can also earn points for lawmakers. One point is also deducted for sponsoring bills opposed by AFP,

TAX AND SPENDING

HB 2960	Corporate Income Tax Reduction Sponsors: Speaker McCall, Pro Tem Treat Reduced the corporate income tax rate from 6 percent to 4 percent. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✓
SB 608	Placed \$30,000,000 into Oklahoma Film Rebate Program Sponsors: Sen. Hall, Rep. Fetgetter Placed \$30 million into the Oklahoma Film Rebate Program. This fund will be used to subsidize film production and sets up a new place for special interests to compete for taxpayer handouts. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✗
HB 2963	Small Business Income Tax Relief Sponsors: Rep. Wallace, Sen. Thompson Decreases the tax rate for S corporations, pass-throughs, and financial institutions from 6 percent to 4 percent. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✓
HB 1060	Waives Sales Tax For Property Transfers Between Subsidiaries and Parent Companies Sponsors: Rep. Boles, Sen. Paxton The bill now no longer requires business entities to pay taxes on property transactions for the transfer of property between parent companies and subsidiaries, thus not requiring taxes be paid on something a company already owns and subject businesses to double taxation. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✓

HB 2962	Individual Income Tax Relief Sponsors: Speaker McCall, Pro Tem Treat Reduced the personal income tax by .25 percent for all brackets. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✓
SB 947	Requiring Identification of Fiscal Impact for Ballot Measures Sponsors: Sen. Rosino, Rep. T West After many measures in the past have had an associated fiscal impact that has not been brought forth during the campaign for the state questions, this bill would require ballot language to serve notice to voters that a proposed measure would cost taxpayer dollars. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✓

HB 1795	Limiting Offenses Eligible for Driver's License Suspension Sponsors: Rep. Miller, Sen. David Will limit the type and overall number of offenses for which the state can revoke an individual's driver's license. <i>Passed: Yes</i>	AFP Position: ✓

CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM *(cont.)*

SB 334

Enhancing Felony Theft Aggregation Time Period
Sponsors: Sen. Paxton, Rep. Worthen

AFP Position: ✖

The bill would have increased the time over which theft crimes are aggregated to trigger misdemeanor or felony penalties to 180 days. This would result in many individuals spending years more in prison and waste taxpayer money on an ineffective response. **Passed: No**

SB 320

Establishing Process for Medical Parole
Sponsors: Sen. Garvin, Rep. McEntire

AFP Position: ✔

Created a pathway for release of an individual who is medically vulnerable or frail to medical parole. **Passed: Yes**

HB1679

Provides Identification to Individuals Leaving DOC Custody
Sponsors: Rep. Stark, Sen. Weaver

AFP Position: ✔

Would require the Department of Corrections to ensure everyone leaving its custody has possession of a valid state ID. The bill was named the Sarah Stitt Act after the first lady gathered nonprofit help to get IDs for the more than 1,200 individuals whose sentence was commuted by Gov. Kevin Stitt in 2019. **Passed: Yes**

HB 2567

Hospice Care Prison Training Program
Sponsors: Rep. C Caldwell, Sen McCortney

AFP Position: ✔

Would have allowed certain individuals in prison to learn the skills necessary to care for fellow inmates in hospice care as well as renter society with employable skills. **Passed: House**

SB 704

Ends Sentence Enhancements for Non-Violent Offenses
Sponsors: Sen. Rader

AFP Position: ✔

Would ensure more proportional punishment by not unnecessarily punishing individuals for past mistakes and enhancing prison sentences to an unreasonable length. **Passed: Senate Public Safety Committee**

SB 814

Recreating Felony Possession Charges
Sponsors: Sen. Bergstrom, Rep. D Hardin

AFP Position: ✖

Would have overturned the will of Oklahoma’s voters by reversing portions of SQ 780 and reestablishing some felony penalties for drug possession. **Passed: No**

SB 336

Earned Compliance Credits for Probation
Sponsors: Sen. Paxton

AFP Position: ✔

Would have allowed individuals on probation to earn credits for good behavior toward shortening their sentences. **Passed: Introduced**

Confirmation of Ryan Walters as Secretary of Education

AFP Position: ✔

Confirmation of Ryan Walters as secretary of education. **Passed: Yes**

LEGISLATIVE VOTE EXPLANATIONS



EDUCATION *(cont.)*

- SB 783**

Open Enrollment
Sponsors: Rep. Boles, Sen. Pugh

AFP Position: ✓

This measure amended Oklahoma’s open transfer statute to allow for the transfer of students to any public school of their choosing. **Passed: Yes**
- HB 2078**

School Funding Formula Reform
Sponsors: Rep. Hilbert, Sen. Taylor

AFP Position: ✓

HB 2078 reduced the hold-harmless provisions, otherwise described as enrollment lookbacks for carryover funding from three years to two years in one lookback and two years to one in the other. This brings public school funding in Oklahoma as close to “real-time” as it has ever been. This formula ensures families and students have the ability to access an education that works better for them. **Passed: Yes**

HEALTH CARE

- SB 734**

Importing Canadian Drug Price Controls
Sponsors: Sen. McCortney, Rep. McEntire

AFP Position: ✗

Would have imposed drug price controls via reference pricing (to Canada) with respect to the 250 highest-cost drugs in Oklahoma. This mandate would have applied to all state-regulated and all voluntarily participating federally regulated health plans in the state. **Passed: No**

REGULATIONS

- SB 913**

Creating the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules
Sponsors: Sen. Daniels, Rep. ODonnell

AFP Position: ✓

By empowering further legislative oversight of the administrative rules process, Oklahoma can begin to rein in the administrative state and better streamline government. The bill also provides an avenue for expedited repeal of administrative rules. **Passed: Yes**
- HB 1032**

Home Bakery Act Expansion
Sponsors: Rep. Mize, Sen. Pugh

AFP Position: ✓

The bill raises the gross income cap for home bakery businesses from \$20,000 to \$75,000, expands the types of foods that can legally be produced in a home kitchen and most importantly, allows for third-party sales of the home-baked goods. **Passed: Yes**

TECH AND INNOVATION

- HB 1602**

Data Privacy Standards and Sanctions
Sponsors: Rep. Walke, Sen. Montgomery

AFP Position: ✗

Creates an onerous, national patch-work of regulation, which that constrict the flow of business and commerce both within the state and nationally. This idea goes against our view of a uniform opt-OUT privacy law. **Passed: No**

LEGISLATIVE VOTE EXPLANATIONS



LABOR

- SB 527

Creates State Run Retirement Accounts Program

Sponsors: Sen. Montgomery, Rep. McEntire

Would have automatically enrolled small business employees into a new government run retirement investment program. *Passed: No*

AFP Position: ✖
- HB 1146

Dissolves Merit Protection Commission;
Removes Classified State Employee Status

Sponsors: Rep. Osburn, Sen. Treat

Phases out the classified designation for state employees and does away with the Merit Protection Commission. Classified employees in Oklahoma are unpromotable and unfireable. Over the years this has entrenched the bureaucracy and made it more difficult to make the state more customer focused. HB 1146 was the culmination of a long-running effort to reform state employment and ultimately reduce the size of state government by one agency. *Passed: Yes*

AFP Position: ✔
- SB 634

Enhanced Ability for Teachers to Refuse
Union Membership

Sponsors: Sen. Daniels, Rep. ODonnell

Allows teachers to opt out of union membership at any point in the calendar year and not accrue any more dues owed to the union. The bill would also provide state sponsored liability insurance to school employees. *Passed: Senate*

AFP Position: ✔
- HB 1981

Universal Recognition for Occupational Licenses

Sponsors: Rep. Lepak, Sen. Paxton

Would have established for state agencies, boards, and commissions a defacto standard of deference toward allowing individuals moving to Oklahoma from other states to have their occupational license recognized and begin working in Oklahoma. *Passed: House Business and Commerce Committee*
