BILL DESCRIPTIONS:

HB 8 | An act relating to revenue measures and declaring an emergency

AFP Position: Support
Outcome: Veto Overridden

HB 8 will reduce the individual income tax rate to 4% for taxable years beginning on or after Jan 1, 2023 and provide a further rate reduction in future years if certain thresholds of total general fund receipts are exceeded, provide that the tax rate shall not exceed a reduction of more than one percentage point in a calendar year, and eliminate the tax credit for a fiduciary and an estate. The bill also adds services to the sales tax in order to balance the tax rate cuts. Gov’s veto overridden.

HB 136 | An act relating to medicinal cannabis and making an appropriation therefor

AFP Position: Support
Outcome: Dead/Failed

Bill would have established a medicinal cannabis program in Kentucky and created an excise tax on certain transfers of medicinal cannabis products. Such a program would allow patients with legitimate medical needs to access innovative treatments under the supervision of a medical professional. Passed KY House of Representatives.

SB 33 | An act relating to expungement

AFP Position: Support
Outcome: Dead/Failed

This bill would have allowed individuals to secure an expungement of their criminal record for a second or third offense if certain time periods have passed since the offense was committed. Passed KY Senate.

HB 9 | An act relating to educational opportunities and making an appropriation therefor

AFP Position: Support
Outcome: Veto Overridden

Bill provides a funding mechanism for charter schools in the state. Establishes Charter School pilots in Louisville and Northern Kentucky. And establishes the Kentucky Public Charter School Commission. Governor’s veto overridden by the General Assembly.

HB 222 | An act relating to legal actions concerning the exercise of a person’s constitutional rights

AFP Position: Support
Outcome: Signed/Enacted

The Uniform Public Expression Protection Act allows judges to dismiss frivolous lawsuits designed to punish people for exercising their right to free speech early in the litigation process. Kentucky joined over twenty-five other states that have acted to protect the free speech rights of their citizens. Signed by Governor.

SB 90 | An act relating to legal proceedings and making an appropriation therefor

AFP Position: Support
Outcome: Signed/Enacted

This bill will establish a behavioral health conditional dismissal pilot program to provide eligible individuals an alternative to receive treatment for a behavioral health disorder instead of incarceration. These individuals may also be provided with the dismissal of their criminal charges upon successful completion of the treatment program. Signed by Governor
