

LEGISLATIVE VOTE EXPLANATIONS

HB 1697 Cottage Foods Industry

Sponsors: Rep. Ben Baker

Removes the cap on annual gross income and the prohibition on online sales, provided that the cottage food production operation and purchaser are both located in Missouri.

HB 1724 Student Freedom of Association

Sponsors: Rep. Brad Hudson

Prohibits public institutions of higher learning from taking any action or enforcing any policy that denies a belief based student association benefits available to other student associations. The bill also prohibits discrimination against a belief based student association based on its requirement that leaders of the association adhere to its sincerely held beliefs, sincere practice requirements, or standards of conduct.

SB 683 Prison Nurseries

Sponsors:

This act establishes the "Correctional Center Nursery Program". The department of corrections shall, subject to appropriations, establish a correctional center nursery in one or more of the correctional centers for women operated by the department. The goal is to allow certain incarcerated mothers the chance to bond and unify with their child.

HB 1814 Open Enrollment

Sponsors: Rep. Brad Pollitt

The bill creates a public school open enrollment program with the design to improve quality instruction and increase parental involvement, provide access to programs and classes, and offer opportunity to align parental curriculum options to personal beliefs.

HB 1552 Charter School Equity Funding

Sponsors: Rep. Doug Richey

The bill specifies that in addition to any state aid remitted to charter schools, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) shall remit to any charter school an amount equal to difference it receives compared to the local school district.

HB 2090 Income Tax Credit

Sponsors: Rep. Dave Griffith

Provides a one time tax credit of \$500 per qualified taxpayer.

HB 2587 Regulatory Sandbox

Sponsors: Rep. Alex Riley

This bill establishes the Regulatory Relief Office, which identifies state laws or regulations that could potentially be waived for participating businesses during a 24 month period in which the participating business demonstrates an innovative product offering to consumers, and creates an application and review process for businesses seeking to enter the Sandbox Program.

HJR 117 Medicaid Expansion Reform

Sponsors: Rep. Cody Smith

Upon voter approval, this proposed Constitutional amendment allows the General Assembly to define eligibility and requirements for MO HealthNet.

HB 1856 Learn Everywhere

Sponsors: Rep. Ben Baker

This bill establishes the "Extended Learning Opportunities Act" and creates extended learning opportunities for out-of-classroom learning experience as approved by the State Board of Education (SBE), school board, or a charter school.

SB 365 Tax Cut

Sponsors: Sen. Lincoln Hough

This act repeals all such scheduled reductions and reduces the top rate of income tax to 4.95% beginning in the 2023 calendar year. This act adds additional potential reductions in the top rate of tax if net revenue growth collections exceeds defined limits, for an eventual rate of 4.5%

HB 3 Agriculture Tax Credits

Sponsors: Rep. Brad Pollitt

This bill establishes and extends several tax credits for various agricultural activities in the state.
