TAXPAYER SCORECARD

AFP's Taxpayer Scorecard is our good faith effort to inform citizens about the performance of their elected representatives. There is no better barometer by which to measure lawmakers' allegiance to fiscal responsibility, economic freedom, and breaking down barriers so every Tennessean can live the American Dream than to evaluate their votes on important legislation. Simply put, their votes are their record. It's worth noting scores are lower than usual because of the number of corporate welfare votes included. You cannot be a Taxpayer Hero while voting to give away billions in tax dollars to select businesses.

Of course, no legislative scorecard can take into consideration every bill affecting taxpayers. Each of Americans for Prosperity-Tennessee's (AFP-TN) legislative priorities is included on this scorecard, as well as any additional issues we communicated support for or opposition to.

TAXPAYER SCORECARD GRADING OVERVIEW

Each legislator is scored based on the legislative votes they took. All votes scored are key votes - legislators were notified in writing of our stance. Three points are awarded for prime sponsorship and one point for co-sponsorship of scored votes. Any sponsorship of a bill will count as a vote in favor of the legislation or a previous committee vote will be cited if the member is not present to vote on the final bill.

For example, Open Enrollment, CON, and Victim's Restitution reform were our top legislative priorities, therefore votes and sponsorship of these** bills are weighted. Each sponsorship for or against key voted legislation triggers a bonus point or demerit added to the final score, respectively.

1 K-12 Funding Reform (TISA) | HB 2143 / SB 2396

The Tennessee Investment in Student Achievement (TISA) is a comprehensive K-12 funding reform. This student-based funding formula replaces our 30-year outdated basic education formula (BEP). AFP supported this legislation because funding should be based on the student and follow the student to meet their educational needs. This formula only addresses funding for students in the public school system. It is the necessary foundation needed to give families educational freedom.

2 Learn Everywhere | HB 1850 / SB 2887

Learn Everywhere, or the expanded course access bill will allow families to select any online course being offered in the school system. Advanced or specialized classes should be available to all students, even if they are not offered in their local school.

3 Dyslexia ESA | HB 751/ SB 1158

This legislation expands the individualized education plan for special-needs students with dyslexia. Thousands of kids across Tennessee struggle with school because their unique learning needs have not been addressed. The dyslexia ESA will let families take a portion of their education funding dollars to seek tutoring or specialized schooling.

4 Open Enrollment** | HB 1305 / SB 788

Allows any student to freely transfer to another school within the same district if an open seat is available and the parents provide transportation. Now school systems must: 1.) publish the number of open seats for at least 14 days prior to the open enrollment or transfer period; 2.) allow students to request transfers to open seats for at least 30 days; and, 3.) if there are more requests than open seats available the district must hold a lottery to determine who gets the seats – no more cherry-picking. This should alleviate some over-crowding by allowing families to choose a different school if desired. Once the student is enrolled in the new school they are considered part of that school going through the last grade year offered at the transfer school.

5 \$500M Taxpayer-Funded Stadium | HB 2886 / SB 2901

This bond bill put taxpayers on the hook for funding a new football stadium in Nashville, with a starting cost of \$500,000,000 that is likely to balloon to \$710 million. There is little proof to substantiate sports stadiums create new economic growth, and even less evidence when they are being replaced.

6 Hotel Tax Hike for Stadium | HB 681 / SB 421

This bill allows Nashville to increase its hotel-motel tax rate by 1% to pay for its portion of the proposed replacement football stadium. This is not a user-generated tax, because it will be collected every day from visitors and residents even though stadium events do not occur daily.

7 Ford \$1.2 Billion Tax Incentive | HB / SB 8002

Appropriates \$884 million for roads, operations, site work, consulting services and a \$500 million grant to Ford. This bill went from an initial \$500 Million funding request to well over \$1,000,000,000. This is a prime example of economic and community development warping into corporate welfare, with government picking winners and losers at a cost to taxpayers.

8 Hollywood Handouts | HB 141 / SB 736

Legislators should not reject their duty to the citizens of Tennessee to oversee the power of the purse. Film tax incentives are a bad deal for any state – every dollar spent yields just .07 - .55. That means we lose money that could be spent on higher priorities to properly fund essential services. Despite the tales Hollywood’s best writers can script, that does not include funding red carpet affairs.

9 Non-Profit Targeting | HB 1201 / SB 1005

Under the guise of campaign finance reform, this bill initially targeted donor privacy. As passed, it creates more red tape for non-profits that include a lawmaker’s name or image in any communication in the 60 days before an election. It increases paperwork for watchdog groups that point out lawmakers’ voting records to keep the public informed - like this scorecard.

10 Certificate of Need Reform | HB 948 / SB 1281**

Certificate-of-Need (CON) laws impose arbitrary, bureaucratic regulations that block new hospitals and other healthcare facilities from opening or expanding services without permission from the government. CONs allow existing providers to secretly veto competition from entering the service area. This monopoly leaves Tennesseans with less access and higher costs for health care, especially in rural areas. This bill repealed some CON laws, simplified the process for remaining CONs, cutting the costs and time required in half, and made competitor’s objections public.

11 Locksmith Licensure Repeal | HB 09 / SB 012

Cutting red tape and repeal of an unnecessary law. Many services performed by locksmiths were widely available from businesses that did not require a license. There was no oversight board for locksmiths in and virtually no enforcement for operating without a license. Now small business owners (locksmiths) can work without a government permission slip.

12 Personal Privacy Protection | HB 0159 / SB 1608

Prevents the government from releasing, publicizing, or otherwise publicly disclosing personal information in possession of that public agency; and exempts 501(C) non-profits from providing names or personal information of their supporters. Effective, data-driven re-entry services reduce recidivism and save tax dollars, while improving public safety. Requires one year of mandatory supervision; limits the liability of employers making a good faith hire; removes the Department of Safety's \$65 fee to set up a payment plan for a Restricted Driver's License; increases local jail reimbursement rates per inmate, between \$3 and \$6, for facilities expanding their offering of classes and other re-entry services.

16 CAF Attorney Fees | HB 1254/ SB 1361

For too long, our civil asset forfeiture laws have flipped the presumption of innocence on its head - forcing people to prove their innocence to the government to keep their own property. A property owner who prevails in the administrative proceeding may now recover attorney fees, up to \$10,000. Raising the cap improves the likelihood of finding an attorney and ensuring due process rights are protected until this process can be switched to post-conviction asset forfeiture.


