
AFP TN SD 02

SURVEY RESULTS

The AFP TN SD 02 Survey was conducted by IVR / Landline and Online Mobile Interviews from February 12 - February 17 among a random sample of 330 likely Republican Primary voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 5.6 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.


Q1: Voter Registration



Do you approve of the job that Bill Lee is doing as Governor? Sample Size: 330



Q4 : Image Test


I am going to read some names. For each one, please tell me whether you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion. If you have no opinion or have never heard of the person, just say so.







Q7 : School Choice Income Status


Should the school choice program being proposed be made available to all Tennessee tax-paying citizens, or only those who are of the lowest income? Sample Size: 330

Q8 : Parental Control of Tax Dollars



Q9 : Candidate Proposal Support


Are you more or less likely to vote for a candidate who supports this school choice proposal being promoted by Governor Lee? Sample Size: 330




Q11 : Gender


