
Survey Results

This AFP TN SD 24 survey was conducted by IVR / Landline and Online Mobile Interviews from February 12 - February 17 among a random sample of 331 likely Republican Primary voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 5.6 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.


Q1: Voter Registration



Do you approve of the job that Bill Lee is doing as Governor? Sample Size: 331











Q7 : School Choice Income Status


Should the school choice program being proposed be made available to all Tennessee tax-paying citizens, or only those who are of the lowest income? Sample Size: 331

Q8 : Parental Control of Tax Dollars




Are you more or less likely to vote for a candidate who supports this school choice proposal being promoted by Governor Lee? Sample Size: 331






