

WYOMING FACING THE FISCAL CLIFF



Inflation is a heavy burden on the average Wyoming family.

IT COSTS **\$1,148/MO**, OR **\$31,786** SINCE JAN 2021*

- ✓ For years, reckless spending has driven up the debt burden and is responsible for inflation.
- ✓ Wyoming can't afford to have their tax cuts expire.
- ✓ TCJA fixed major flaws in the tax code and has been an important driver of economic growth.

Unfortunately, key provisions of TCJA will expire next year.

THIS WILL CAUSE THE AVERAGE WYOMING FAMILY'S FEDERAL BILL TO RISE BY **\$4,254**. INCOME TAX RATE HIKES WILL ACCOUNT FOR **\$1,861** OF THIS INCREASE.

- ✓ TCJA expiration will also raise taxes on businesses and slow the economy.
- ✓ There are **4,551 traditional C-corporations** and **16,883 pass-through entities** in Wyoming. These businesses **employ 69,562** and **111,107 Wyoming** residents respectively.

The expiration of economically important, pro-growth provisions will slow the economy and **cost Wyoming 1,900 jobs**.

TAX INCREASE

TCJA expiration will increase the average **Wyoming business's taxes by \$2,231**.

Wasteful health care spending is costing every Wyoming family.

IT COSTS EVERY WYOMING FAMILY OVER **\$550/YEAR.**

- ✓ **\$360** for wasteful “enhanced” ACA subsidies.
- ✓ **\$190** for enrollment fraud and subsidizing health insurance for individuals who earn over \$60,000 annually (*paragoninstitute.org*).

OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS, THE “ENHANCEMENTS”:

- ✓ **Will cost U.S. taxpayers \$383 billion** (about \$3,600 per family).
- ✓ Will cost Wyoming taxpayers **\$669 million.**
