A time-honored tradition of Americans for Prosperity–Pennsylvania, the commonwealth’s largest grassroots accountability organization, is the release of our annual legislative scorecard. For years, it has served as both a celebration of policymakers who defend hardworking taxpayers in Harrisburg and a tool for constituents to hold their elected officials accountable for how they vote on the issues that matter most.

As the second half of the 2025–26 legislative session begins, lawmakers have an opportunity to reset the tone and direction in Harrisburg. After years marked by razor-thin majorities, shifting leadership dynamics, and partisan gridlock, Pennsylvanians are looking for something different. They’re not interested in political maneuvering—they’re demanding results from their elected officials. Taxpayers expect a return on their investment, and this new session presents a fresh opportunity to members to deliver.

Each legislative session spans two years, and with a full year to go, lawmakers have both the time and the mandate to advance policies that expand opportunity, remove barriers to prosperity, and restore trust in state government. The question on taxpayers’ minds is whether Harrisburg will seize the moment.

The issue top of mind for Pennsylvania constituents is affordability—or, in Pennsylvania’s case, lack thereof. Housing remains unattainable for first-time homebuyers, largely due to lack of availability. State taxes continue to crush hard-working families while the heavy hand of Harrisburg government puts new regulations on our entrepreneurs. There’s opportunity for improvement: make land use reform a bipartisan priority, put a halt to Harrisburg’s bureaucratic red tape by passing the REINS Act, and get our fiscal house in order by supporting better budgeting reforms such as the Responsible Budgeting Act.

There is clear opportunity for bipartisan progress. Lawmakers can advance free-market health care reforms that empower patients and lower costs, such as expanding access to association health plans and granting full practice authority to nurse practitioners. These reforms increase access, encourage competition, and put families, not bureaucracies, in the driver’s seat.

The start of a new year is a chance to chart a different course. Divided government does not have to mean delayed progress. In fact, it can create the conditions for thoughtful compromise and durable policy wins that stand the test of time.

For the sake of our commonwealth, lawmakers must focus on solutions that expand freedom and opportunity. Pennsylvanians are watching. Taxpayers are engaged. And through our 2025–26 Mid-Session Legislative Scorecard, we will continue ensuring that elected officials are accountable to the people they serve.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

HB145 | IN COMPENSATION, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR INELIGIBILITY FOR COMPENSATION.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

Would allow striking union workers to receive unemployment compensation, empowering unions to disrupt private businesses backed by taxpayer resources.

HB150 | IN SENTENCING, REPEALING PROVISIONS RELATING TO TRANSFER OF INMATES IN NEED OF MEDICAL TREATMENT AND PROVIDING FOR MODIFICATION OF AN IMPOSED TERM OF IMPRISONMENT FOR REASONS OF ILLNESS.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Support

Modernizes Pennsylvania's medical release provisions. Requires judges to consider the type of crime the individual committed, their disciplinary record while incarcerated, and their risk to the community if they were to be released and treated for their illness outside of a correctional facility. Requires judges to take into consideration the voices of victims and the recommendations of correction officials who have the best knowledge of the infirm inmate.

HB200 | ESTABLISHING THE FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE PROGRAM, THE FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE FUND AND THE FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE ADVISORY BOARD; CONFERRING POWERS AND IMPOSING DUTIES ON THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES.

Outcome: In Committee

AFP's Position: Oppose

Establishing mandatory paid Family and Medical Leave Program, the Family and Medical Leave Fund and the Family and Medical Leave Advisory Board; conferring powers and imposing duties on the Department of Labor and Industry; and imposing penalties.

HB374 | IN PRIMARY AND ELECTION EXPENSES, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR REPORTING BY CANDIDATE AND POLITICAL COMMITTEES AND OTHER PERSONS AND FOR LATE CONTRIBUTIONS AND INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURES.

Outcome: In Committee

AFP's Position: Oppose

Expands donor disclosure requirements to include any 501(c) organization making independent expenditures.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

HB404 | IN CASUALTY INSURANCE, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS SUBJECT TO WHICH POLICIES ARE TO BE ISSUED AND FOR HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR CERTAIN CHILDREN OF INSURED PARENTS.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

In casualty insurance, further providing for conditions subject to which policies are to be issued and for health insurance coverage for certain children of insured parents.

HB411 | IN MEMBERSHIP, CONTRIBUTIONS AND BENEFITS, PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTAL ANNUITY COMMENCING 2025; AND, IN BENEFITS, PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTAL ANNUITY COMMENCING 2025.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

In membership, contributions and benefits, providing for supplemental annuity commencing 2025; and, in benefits, providing for supplemental annuity commencing 2025.

HB505 | IN RESTRUCTURING OF ELECTRIC UTILITY INDUSTRY, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND CONSERVATION PROGRAM.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

The bill creates mandatory "efficiency" targets to reduce overall energy consumption and provides incentives for homes/businesses to adopt and purchase green energy upgrades, such as heat pumps or solar panels and batteries. The goal of efficiency is an end around to reduce the energy dispatched by fossil fuel fired sources instead of developing more energy dispatching sources to meet the needs of the grid and ratepayers. Additionally, allows for some cost recovery provisions.

HB535 | PROVIDING FOR HEALTH CARE INSURANCE COVERAGE PROTECTIONS; IMPOSING DUTIES ON THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT AND THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

Providing for health care insurance coverage protections; imposing duties on the Insurance Department and the Insurance Commissioner; and imposing penalties.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

HB618 | PROVIDING FOR HEALTH INSURANCE ACCESS PROTECTIONS; IMPOSING DUTIES ON THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT AND THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

Providing for health insurance access protections; imposing duties on the Insurance Department and the Insurance Commissioner; and imposing penalties.

HB755 - PROVIDING FOR HEALTH CARE INSURANCE PREVENTIVE SERVICES COVERAGE PROTECTIONS; CONFERRING AUTHORITY ON THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT AND THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER; AND PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS, FOR ENFORCEMENT AND FOR PENALTIES.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

Providing for health care insurance preventive services coverage protections; conferring authority on the Insurance Department and the Insurance Commissioner; and providing for regulations, for enforcement and for penalties.

HB846 | FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS, FOR SPECIFICATIONS, FOR PREVAILING WAGE AND FOR DUTY OF SECRETARY.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Oppose

Further providing for definitions, for specifications, for prevailing wage and for duty of secretary. Adds "custom fabrication" and offsite work on parts construction within prevailing wage mandates.

SB6 | PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF PERMITS BY STATE AGENCIES, FOR A TRACKING SYSTEM FOR PERMIT APPLICATIONS, FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PERMIT PROGRAMS, FOR THIRD-PARTY REVIEW OF PERMIT DECISION DELAYS AND FOR ANNUAL REPORTS; ESTABLISHING THE PENNSYLVANIA OFFICE OF TRANSFORMATION AND OPPORTUNITY AND THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY GROUP; AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Support

Providing for the administration of permits by State agencies, for a tracking system for permit applications, for the establishment of permit programs, for third-party review of permit decision delays and for annual reports; establishing the Pennsylvania Office of Transformation and Opportunity and the Economic Development Strategy Group; and providing for their powers and duties.


BILL DESCRIPTIONS

SB72 | FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS, FOR IMPROPER CLASSIFICATION OF EMPLOYEES AND FOR CRIMINAL PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION; AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES, FOR RETALIATION FOR ACTION PROHIBITED, FOR AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION, FOR USE OF PENALTY FUNDS AND FOR FUNDING.

Outcome: In Committee

AFP's Position: Oppose

Adds stiff "worker misclassification" penalties with an aim of discouraging independent contracting in construction and trades work. Entities found guilty pay penalties and are barred for periods of time from public works projects/contracts.



SB207 | IN CORPORATE NET INCOME TAX, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR IMPOSITION OF TAX.

Outcome: In Committee

AFP's Position: Support

Lowers the corporate income tax to 4% in 2026, accelerating PA's corporate income tax rate reduction.

SB311 | IN PREEMPTIONS, PROVIDING FOR RESTRICTIONS ON UTILITY SERVICES PROHIBITED.

Outcome: Crossed Over

AFP's Position: Support

This bill protects consumer choice and promotes market-driven innovation by preventing local governments from imposing bans on specific utility connections. Allowing energy decisions to be made by individuals and businesses, instead of through fragmented local mandates, ensures a competitive energy marketplace, reduces regulatory uncertainty, and supports economic growth across the Commonwealth. SB 311 is a principled stand for energy freedom, economic opportunity, and limited government.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

SB333 | FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS, FOR PROPOSED REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR REVIEW AND FOR FINAL-FORM REGULATIONS AND FINAL-OMITTED REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR REVIEW; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS DEEMED WITHDRAWN; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR PROCEDURES FOR SUBSEQUENT REVIEW OF DISAPPROVED FINAL-FORM OR FINAL-OMITTED REGULATIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUIRED FOR ECONOMICALLY SIGNIFICANT REGULATIONS.

Outcome: Crossed Over
AFP's Position: Support

Increasing requirements for regulatory review. Includes requirements for the Independent Fiscal Office to prepare cost estimates.

SB444 | FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS AND FOR EXISTING REGULATIONS.

Outcome: Crossed Over
AFP's Position: Support

Amends the definition of "economically significant" regulations.

SB474 | PROVIDING FOR ZERO-BASED BUDGETING RELATING TO THE COMMONWEALTH'S BUDGET REVIEW.

Outcome: In Committee
AFP's Position: Support

Requires the governor to use zero-based budgeting reviews for at least one-fifth of General Fund spending each year.

SB755 | AMENDING THE ACT OF NOVEMBER 27, 2019 (P.L.667, NO.92), ENTITLED "AN ACT ABOLISHING NUMEROUS STATE AUTHORITIES, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, COUNCILS AND REPRESENTATIVES; AND MAKING RELATED REPEALS," FURTHER PROVIDING FOR STATE AUTHORITIES, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, COUNCILS AND REPRESENTATIVES ABOLISHMENT; PROVIDING FOR COMPOSITION OF PENNSYLVANIA HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION, FOR TRANSFER OF DUTIES AND FOR DUTY OF SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH RELATING TO INTERSTATE RAIL PASSENGER ADV

Outcome: Crossed Over
AFP's Position: Support

Amending the act of November 27, 2019 (P.L.667, No.92), entitled "An act abolishing numerous State authorities, boards, commissions, committees, councils and representatives; and making related repeals," further providing for State authorities, boards, commissions, committees, councils and representatives abolishment; providing for composition of Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission, for transfer of duties and for duty of Secretary of the Commonwealth relating to Interstate Rail Passenger Adv.

SB1068 | PROVIDING FOR THE ABROGATION OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CO2 BUDGET TRADING PROGRAM.

Outcome: Crossed Over
AFP's Position: Support

Providing for the abrogation of regulations relating to the CO2 Budget Trading Program.
